Privacy Policy

April 2021

1. Scope

This Privacy Policy informs you of how City Cancer Challenge Foundation, rue du Commerce 9, 1204 Geneva, Switzerland ("C/Can"), as data controller, may collect and process your data, including personal data.

C/Can takes the protection of your data and personal data seriously, meaning that C/Can processes your data and personal data with due care and in accordance with applicable data protection laws.

2. Consent

By accepting this Privacy Policy, you explicitly agree to the processing of the data and personal data you provide to C/Can for the purposes mentioned hereinafter and be legally bound by and explicitly consent to this Privacy Policy, as it may be amended from time to time.

If you complete the City Needs Assessment Questionnaire, you also explicitly agree that you will not share any part of the questionnaire or resulting data without the prior permission of C/Can.

Wherever processing of your personal data by C/Can is based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time by contacting C/Can at the contact details below. Withdrawal of your consent does not affect the lawfulness of processing of your personal data based on consent before your withdrawal.

3. Data collected

As part of the C/Can City Needs Assessment process, C/Can collects data about relevant institutions such as name of institution, services available and health workforce. Your responses are confidential and C/Can does not in principle collect identifying information such as your name or IP address. Notwithstanding the foregoing, should data collected include personal data (i.e. information relating to an identified or identifiable person, such as your name or

email address), C/Can will comply with the applicable data protection legal requirements.

4. Purposes of the processing

As mentioned above, data are collected and processed as part of the C/Can City Needs Assessment process whose purpose is to provide in-depth information on the quality and capacity of cancer care services in a city.

Data will be analysed in aggregate and institutions will remain anonymous. However, institutional level data is available to relevant C/Can staff only – who are bound by appropriate confidentiality obligations – and will only be shared externally with the prior permission of the given institution.

If you complete the City Needs Assessment questionnaire, the results of the questionnaire and related data and personal data will only be used for the purposes of identifying a city's key capacities, major needs, and priority actions to address cancer care gaps. This will be used as a baseline for continuous monitoring and evaluation of progress in quality cancer care delivery and global trend analyses.

C/Can might also process your personal data for its compelling legitimate interests, compliance with legal and regulatory obligations or court orders, exercise and/or defense of legal rights, reporting to and/or being audited by regulatory bodies and record keeping obligations.

5. Legal basis

As mentioned in Section 2 above, processing of your personal data is based on your consent.

In certain cases, the processing of your personal data might be based on the legitimate interests of C/Can or a legal obligation to which C/Can is subject.

6. Storage duration

C/Can will not keep your personal data for any longer than is necessary in light of the reason(s) for which it was first collected or provided, subject to any legal, regulatory or contractual requirements and the time in which any litigation or investigations might arise.

7. Your rights

You are entitled to submit C/Can a request by using the contact details below in order to:

- have access to your personal data and obtain information in relation to its processing;
- request the completion or correction of your personal data that is incomplete or inaccurate;
- restrict or object to the processing of your personal data;
- erase your personal data;
- receive, or request C/Can to transmit to another designated person or entity, your personal data in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format; and
- wherever processing of your personal data by C/Can is based on your consent, withdraw your consent to the processing of your personal data.

Please note that the above rights can be limited – for example, when C/Can needs your personal data to comply with the law or assert or defend against legal claims or has other compelling legitimate grounds for the processing that override your interests, rights and freedoms. C/Can may therefore be able to continue processing your personal data even after you have chosen to withdraw your consent or objected to the processing of your personal data to the extent required or otherwise permitted by law.

C/Can may request the provision of additional information to confirm your identity if it has reasonable doubts concerning the identity of the person making the request.

8. Security

C/Can implements and maintains appropriate safeguards to ensure data confidentiality, availability and integrity in accordance with relevant national and international regulations as well as C/Can Guidelines. In particular, all data is stored in a secure server and access to the C/Can Data Portal is password and firewall protected.

If, despite the security measures, a security breach would occur that is likely to result in a risk for your personal data, C/Can will inform you, as well as relevant authorities when required by applicable data protection laws, about the security breach as soon as reasonably possible.

9. Disclosure

C/Can will never share your data with third parties (including for private or commercial purposes), subject to disclosure required by any applicable law or competent authority.

10. International transfer

C/Can is a Swiss Foundation located in the Canton of Geneva. If you are located outside Switzerland, please note that your personal data will be transferred to and processed in Switzerland. Swiss data protection laws may differ from those of your jurisdiction.

Should C/Can need to transfer your personal data to a country that is not regarded as ensuring an adequate level of protection for personal information by the European Commission and/or the Swiss Federal Data Protection and Information Commissioner, C/Can will put in place appropriate safeguards in accordance with applicable legal requirements to ensure that your personal data is adequately protected.

11. Your obligations

You must ensure that data and personal data you provide to C/Can is correct, accurate, current, truthful and compliant with any applicable laws.

Insofar as you provide C/Can with personal data about third parties, you represent and warrant that you have the right to share such personal data and, where necessary, have obtained sufficient informed consent from the concerned data subjects and provided them with all necessary information, as may be required by applicable law or agreement, in order for C/Can to process and store any such personal data without taking any further steps. In particular, you must ensure the concerned data subjects are aware of the various matters detailed in this Privacy Policy, including without limitation the identity of C/Can, how to contact C/Can, the purposes of the processing and the data subjects' rights.

12. Amendments to the Privacy Policy

C/Can reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to amend this Privacy Policy at any time if required in order to reflect changes in C/Can data processing practices, in personal data protection laws or otherwise. The amended Privacy Policy will be posted on the C/Can website. If the changes are significant (e.g. your personal data will be processed for new purposes), C/Can will require your consent.

C/Can is committed to working with you to obtain a fair resolution of any complaint or concern about privacy. If, however, you believe that C/Can has not been able to assist with your complaint or concern, this Privacy Policy is without prejudice of your right to make a complaint to the competent data protection authority.
