C/Can leads a city-based partnership initiative that aims to improve access to quality cancer care in cities around the world by transforming the way stakeholders from the public and private sectors collectively design, plan, and implement cancer solutions.

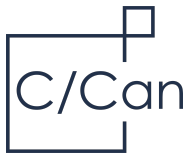
Currently active in cities across Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe and Latin America, the approach is built on the core principle that cities can drive impact at national level by crafting data-driven solutions with the support of a network of global, regional, and local partners that reflect an understanding of the unique local context.

C/Can is a fast-paced and entrepreneurial environment for professionals willing to make an impact in Global Health and believing in the power of collaboration, transparency, inclusivity and agility.

C/Can was launched by the Union for International Cancer Control (UICC) at the 2017 World Economic Forum Annual Meeting in Davos. It was established as a standalone Swiss foundation in January 2019.

Summary of Position

As C/Can strives to bring a pragmatic yet innovative approach to advance cancer care in low and middle income countries, an important effort has been launched to help cities make an impact in the local health financing landscape.



The Health Financing manager will play an essential role in supporting C/Can cities to run real world data collection and analysis to support informed health financing decisions, as well as convening experts and decision makers around local health financing challenges. We are therefore searching for an analytical and self-driven individual to ensure cities have the right tools and technical cooperation available to plan investments adequately, advocate and improve the affordability of care locally and optimise the usage of existing resources in the system.

The Health Financing manager will be part of the Health Financing & Innovation team but will work across the organisation to ensure the successful development, advance and delivery of projects.

Key Responsibilities

The Health Financing Manager has responsibilities in

1. Lead the development and implementation of data collection & analysis tools for health financing

- Introduce, train and support city stakeholders to utilise existing tools as part of their ongoing projects
- Co-design new forecasting (service, product and HR demand), costing and value assessment tools with external experts, city stakeholders and institutional partners
- Work hand in hand with C/Can city stakeholders to ensure that city data deep dives and analysis add value to their' projects

2. Coordinate the health financing technical cooperation effort

- Act as an interface between city teams and technical partners to ensure city needs are met by partners' expertise and solutions
- Supervise consultants supporting city teams in delivering outputs related to health financing
- Review and ensure quality of data deep dives and health financing outputs
- Collaborate with Digital Health, Technical Cooperation and Capacity Development to ensure the timely and quality execution of city projects



3. Document and administer health financing projects

- Ensure project documentation is complete and utilised on an ongoing basis
- Support the Monitoring & Evaluation of data deep dives and health financing projects
- Generate aggregated data-driven reports and insights for internal and external usage
- Produce content for communication purposes

4. Coordinate global cross-city Projects on health financing & innovation

- Contribute to driving cross-city solution development projects and dialogues with partners, experts and prospects in the private sector, financial institutions, technology and global health community
- Ensure the timely delivery and tracking of activities in collaboration with other C/Can team members

Selection Criteria

Required work experience

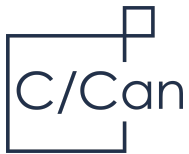
- 4 years + of professional experience in a fast pace and data-driven work environment (development finance institution, investment banking, management consulting, data analyst, etc)
